HOW THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGs) ARE SHAPING THE LIVES AND FUTURE WELLBEING OF CHILDREN





In May 2018, during a UNEP/OECD event on sustainable lifestyles, Solitaire Townsend (Co-founder of the change-agency Futerra) 'hacked' the 17 Sustainable Development Goals into a set of personal actions called 'The Good Life Goals'. They are lifestyle asks for individuals that are carefully aligned with the SDGs 169 targets and indicators. The Good Life Goals were created to bridge the gap between the Sustainable Development Goals and the sustainable lifestyles movement.

Their aim was to help policy-makers, businesses, civil society groups, educators and creative professionals inspire enthusiasm, connection and action from the public in support of the SDGs. By providing personally-relevant links to each SDG, the Good Life Goals send a message that we all, individually and collectively, can play an important role in the future. We all have the right, responsibility, and the opportunity to change the world for the better.

Inspired by this, in 2019 the Flourish Project created its own version of the Goals by mapping the 17 goals against the 7 Aspects of the Flourish Values Model and, in each case, highlighting the huge importance of the goals for shaping the lives and future wellbeing of children.








































NO POVERTY

- Understand how economic poverty compromises the foundations of wellbeing
- Understand how time poverty compromises early human relationships
- Understand how and why poverty is linked to ACES (Adverse Childhood Experiences)
- Demand tax systems that support the health of children and families
- Demand an economic system that serves both people and planet





ZERO HUNGER

- Ensure all children have access to healthy, balanced diets
- Help children to learn how we farm, fish and make our food
- Help children to understand the importance of buying local
- Help children to understand what healthy bodies need
- Help children to understand the supply and demand of food in different countries

GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Specific asks:

- Ensure all children feel safe in their local environments
- Ensure that all children have the time and space to play and have adequate exercise
- Ensure that all children can maximise their innate skills and capacities
- Ensure that all children have access to beauty and the arts
- Ensure that we focus on the wellbeing of the Whole Child (i.e. physical, mental, emotional and spiritual)

QUALITY EDUCATION

- Make sure everyone understands that learning is a lifelong path
- Ensure that all children have access to quality education
- Ensure that children understand success as about who they are, as well as what they achieve
- Ensure that children understand risk and failure as an essential part of the process
- Ensure that teachers are valued and respected as hugely important people






GENDER EQUALITY

- Understand how and why children start to see other people as different
- Understand the roots of values, beliefs and behaviours
- Understand the huge importance and influence of early human development
- Defend anything that compromises the rights and freedoms of childhood
- Protect children from the negative patterns of the past



CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION

- Defend children's rights to clean water and hygienic environments
- Help children learn where water comes from and why clean water matters
- Look at what families can do to save water
- Report and fix leaks big or small
- Support local campaign to conserve and protect
- water supplies




AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY

- Help children to understand where sources of energy come from
- Help children to understand how energy sources are finite
- Help children to learn how to save energy in their everyday activities

- Protect children from the negative patterns of the past






INDUSTRY INNOVATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- Involve children in conversations about the pros and cons of digital technology
- Help children contribute to things that benefit people and planet

- Help children understand that a healthy planet is their birthright






REDUCED INEQUALITIES


- Help children to listen and learn from others
- Help children to understand that other people are different from them (and that this is fine!)
- Help children to protect and care for anyone that is more needy and vulnerable than them
- Help children to respect and value adults and systems that treat people fairly

SUSTAINABLE CITIES AND COMMUNITIES


- Involve children in local decision-making
- Ask children what most matters to them
- Ensure children can get to know their neighbours and local communities
- Involve children in protecting local trees, wildlife and natural areas
- Ensure that children have access to safe and good quality public transport



RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

- Help children to learn about sustainable development
- Help children to think about how to re-use, repair, recycle, share and borrow
- Help children to waste less food and use leftovers
- Help children to collect friends and experiences, not just things
- Help children to demand that local businesses respect people and planet






CLIMATE ACTION

- Help children to learn about climate solutions
- Help children to think about and call for more renewable energy sources
- Help children to eat more local plants, fruits and vegetables
 - and to cut down on meat
- Help children to be able to walk and cycle rather than being driven
- Help children to demand local leaders take bold climate action today





LIFE BELOW WATER

- Help children to learn about life in our seas and oceans
- Help children to understand recycling and that their litter often ends up in the water
- Help children to say no to unnecessary plastic
- Help children to understand why it is important to buy and eat sustainable fish and seafood
- Help children to demand leaders end ocean pollution





LIFE ON LAND

- Help children to enjoy the wonders of the natural world
- Help children to recognise and understand native plants and animals
- Help children to recognise and avoid products made from endangered wildlife

Specific asks:


- Help children to understand their rights as young citizens




- Help children to know and understand the 17 Sustainable Development Goals
